1. These jurisdictions have adhered to the Joint Statement on the CARF which includes an intent to work towards swiftly transposing the CARF into domestic law and activating exchange agreements in time for exchanges to commence by 2027, subject to national legislative procedures as applicable.

2. These jurisdictions are in the process of making a political commitment to implement the CARF as part of the Global Forum's CARF commitment process and they expect to make the commitment in due course.
